

Clauses of consent to processing of personal data in StethoMe sp. z o.o.

Disclosure requirement

Who is the data administrator?

The administrator of the personal data is StethoMe sp. z o.o. (limited liability company) having its seat in Poznań (Poland) at the address ul. Winogrody 18A, entered into the Entrepreneur Register kept by the District Court Poznań - Nowe Miasto i Wilda in Poznań, 8th Commercial Division of the Polish National Court Register (KRS) under the KRS number 0000558650, NIP (tax id. no.): 783 1726542, REGON (Polish National Business Register Number): 361535342.

Who can I contact regarding my personal data?

What is the scope in which my personal data is processed by StethoMe[®]?

StethoMe[®] process the personal data for the purposes of both current recruitment and future recruitments.

What are the purposes of data processing? What are the legal grounds for data processing?

We process your data in order to conduct both the current recruitment and the future recruitments. The legal grounds for processing are provided by Article 6 Paragraph 1 Letter a. of GDPR.

Is my data processed in any other manner?

We do not process your data in any other manner.

Who is the recipient or what are the categories of recipients of my data?

The recipients of your personal data may include entities that support the process of the current recruitment and/or future recruitments.

Will my data be provided to third countries or international institutions?

Your data will be provided neither to third countries nor international institutions.

For how long will my data be processed?

We will process your personal data for the duration of the current and future recruitments, not longer, however, than two years after the date of you sending us your CV.

Am I obligated to provide my data?

Provision of personal data results from the content of Article 22¹ of the Polish Labour.

What are my rights?

As the administrator of data, we provide you with access to your data. Your rights include the right to:

- a) rectify your data [Article 16 of GDPR],
- b) delete your data [Article 17 of GDPR],
- c) limit the processing of your data [Article 18 of GDPR],
- d) object [Article 21 of GDPR],
- e) if applicable – transfer your data [Article 20 of GDPR],
- f) file a complaint to the appropriate supervisory body,
- g) withdraw the consent to processing of your data that you granted.

You can withdraw the consent to processing of your personal data that you granted us at any moment. Please remember, however, that withdrawal of consent will only have effect for the future actions. Withdrawal of consent has no impact on data processing that took place prior to it.

What does the GDPR acronym mean

This acronym means the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council [EU] 2016/679 of 27th of April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC [general regulation on data protection].
